When faxing your absentee ballot request, it is a good idea to call the Absentee Department voice mail box at 918-596-8833, leaving your name and telephone number where you can be reached, stating you have sent an absentee ballot request by fax. If we find the fax did not transmit, we will notify you within 24 hours. This courtesy will not apply on the last day in which ballots can be mailed.

In-person absentee voting is available before all elections at the Tulsa County Election Board on the preceding Friday & Monday 8:00am to 6:00pm. For Federal and State Elections, in-person absentee voting is also available on Saturday 8:00am to 1:00pm.
