### Interlocal Cooperative Jail Financing Agreement By and Between the BOCC of Tulsa County and the Tulsa County Criminal Justice Authority – Diane Hamilton

Diane Hamilton, Budget Office, provided a summary of the terms of the agreement of Section 9.3 of the Interlocal Cooperative Jail Financing Agreement, CJA Revenue in Excess of Estimated Revenue and a report detailing the sales tax report. Hamilton explained an excess of revenue in the amount of \$986,379 for fiscal year 18/19 currently exists. Discussion ensued concerning potential disposition of the excess amount and the correct way to decide how to handle the disposition of the funds. This topic will be included as an agenda item to a regularly scheduled Budget Board agenda.


Initial observation of the bids is that there was no cost reduction for the inclusion of the second chiller in the scope of work. The proposed bid for each item under base bid and alternates are identical. Therefore there is no monetary incentive for doing repair work for both chillers.

The decision to repair both chillers at this time would be based more on the security of having both chillers brought to a known base line operating condition prior to occupying the building. In addition, the identification of possible future repairs from the evaluation of the unit during overhaul will provide information for future budgeting and projection of capital expenditure for future replacement of the existing chillers. If the second chiller operating condition is not evaluated and addressed now, there is the potential of an unforeseen failure anytime.

Overhaul of each chiller will also have the benefit of a 5 year warranty period for the chiller overhauled. The chiller warranty in both bids was contingent upon contracting a 5 year service agreement with the bidder. The extended warranties listed in Alternate 5 and 6 were bid only by Trane, which noted acceptance of the extended warranty would require extension of the service PM service agreement with Trane. Note factory restoration of the chiller compressor/motor would be covered under a factory warranty.

The existing chiller refrigerant type, R11, has been discontinued for a significant period and its replacement refrigerant, R123, is being eliminated from use in new equipment as of 2020 with stopping of production as of 2030. New refrigerants have been and will be developed along with redesign of chillers compatible with the new refrigerants. Since the chiller industry is entering into a significant period of change, it is my opinion it is prudent to extend the life of the existing equipment long enough for the industry to finish development and proof of performance of the new chillers coming in the near future before replacing the existing chillers. The 5 year warranty takes the existing chillers through the initial new product development period. The cost of the extended warranties may be better applied to the capital expenditure of new equipment purchase.

Until the overhaul of the chiller is started, it cannot be determined how many if any of the Alternate 4 additional repairs will be required. The possible total added cost of multiple repairs could be significant and warrant re-evaluation of maintaining the chiller in service. It would be advisable to discuss this possibility with the successful bidder and determine the options available to potentially cancel the work and secure purchase of a new unit. The depth of work necessary to come to this level of evaluation would need to be determined and an agreement for termination established.





In both cases, the award will increase technological capacity to support criminal investigations of violent crimes. With the rapid development of technology in the field of public safety, the acquisition of these tools will exponentially increase the effectiveness of criminal investigations and prosecutions.

### **District Attorney's Office**

Evidence of just about any crime can be found on a cell phone. For this reason, it is imperative that the District Attorney's Office have the capability of conducting forensic cell phone examinations of suspect's phones. One of the best tools on the market today for conducting forensic cell phone examinations is made by Cellbrite. When properly trained, the investigators working for the District Attorney can use Cellbrite to assist other law enforcement agencies which also could benefit by this technology.

### Tulsa County Sheriff's Office

In 2017 Congress passed and President Trump signed the Federal Rapid DNA law. This law directs the FBI to work with local law enforcement agencies with the deployment of the Rapid DNA technology in jails as part of the booking screening process. # Sheriff Vic Regalado wants policy framework, local partnerships in place before using Rapid DNA

While some other states may be using the relatively new Rapid DNA technology, Oklahoma is touted as the first to enshrine its use into law.

Gov. Kevin Stitt in May signed Senate Bill 184, which allows law enforcement to use Rapid DNA in lieu of sending samples to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation for testing. State law already allows for DNA samples to be taken upon a felony arrest.

Rusty Byers, a senior director of the company that owns the technology, said Friday he's receiving several requests each week for copies of Oklahoma's original legislation.

"What has happened in

Oklahoma is going to reverberate in public safety for years," Byers said.

Colorado-based ANDE touts its Rapid DNA technology as mobile, rugged and able to be operated by a nontechnical user to obtain a DNA profile within two hours. Forensic

Rapid DNA policies have been developed by NDIS and SWGDAM (Scientific Working Group on DNA Analysis Methods), and developmental validation studies were designed to ensure that the ANDE Rapid DNA Identification System generates results equivalent to those from an accredited forensic laboratory. ANDE is the only solution to meet and exceed these requirements.

#### THE POWER OF LOCAL DATABASES

#### What is the advantage of a state or local database under local control?

DNA is currently used to provide definitive identifications using strict standards for comparisons and entry into a national database. This is a valuable tool that must be maintained, but DNA can do much more to provide assistance to law enforcement and prosecutions. Common alleles can direct an investigation toward or away from a suspect whether or not the DNA ID has sufficient data for a full identification. Partial information can be stored as a reference. A commonly accepted statistic is that 80% of crime is local further highlighting the importance of a local/state database.

#### **CASE WORK**

#### How can Rapid DNA be used to support investigations?

Getting DNA results in less than two (2) hours opens up previously unattainable advantages for law enforcement and victims. The ability to quickly identify, include, or exclude persons through DNA ID's can be critical to the course of an investigation. Comparisons can be made between known subjects and crime scene collections while the scene is still under law enforcement control or the subject is in an interview room. Developing investigative leads quickly and with NDIS level accuracy can make all the difference in time sensitive cases such as human trafficking, sexual assaults and other violent crimes. ANDE's unique ability to provide law enforcement with a ruggedized and mobile solution allows for processing of vital samples at the point of contact in the field, a lab setting or in the station. A final key component of casework is CODIS confirmations. Agency rules for CODIS confirmations vary nationally but its undeniable that a two (2) hour turnaround time significantly benefits investigators.

Their local database has been populated with more than 163,000 DNA ID's using this method that takes advantage of Rapid DNA capabilities. Orange County has been able to increase plea bargains, reduce court cost and solve crimes faster as a result of Rapid DNA. The Orange County DA's Office is experiencing a dramatic increase in criminal confessions and plea bargains based on law enforcement's ability to confront the accused with validated DNA results. Rapid DNA is following the same technology advancement paths as other critical tools for law enforcement; electronic fingerprints, breathalyzer testing and field-based drug testing kits (NIK). ANDE is committed to supporting our customers throughout the adjudication process with expert witness testimony and scientific validations as part of our overall solution.

#### THE COST OF RAPID DNA

The ANDE Rapid DNA solution is designed to be a part of the larger public safety ecosystem with agency experts and leadership determining where the technology can best be deployed to impact crime. As with any new technology, Rapid DNA carries a slightly higher price tag over traditional lab-based DNA processing. At this point, the tradeoff is time vs. expense with investigators determining where a two (2) hour response time is most critical. Over the last year, due to growing demand and market acceptance, ANDE has been able to reduce the cost per sample and fully expects those costs to continue to decrease moving forward. 

### Rapid DNA is the generation of a DNA ID to identify an individual quickly (less than 2 hours).

The faster DNA results are available, the more they can impact critical military, forensic, homeland security, and intelligence decisions. And to maximize the impact of DNA identification for law enforcement, homeland defense, disaster victim identification and military applications, rapid DNA systems must be operable in the field.

The FBI defines Rapid DNA as "the fully automated (hands free) process of developing a CODIS Core Loci STR profile from a reference sample buccal swab. The "swab in – profile out" process consists of automated extraction, amplification, separation, detection, and allele calling without human intervention."

### ANDE Rapid DNA is the first to receive FBI approval under new standards

On June 4, 2018, ANDE received National DNA Index System (NDIS) approval from the FBI. The approval allows accredited NDIS laboratories to process DNA samples using the ANDE system and search the resulting ANDE DNA IDs<sup>TM</sup> against the FBI's Combined DNA Index System (CODIS) program, without manual interpretation or technical review,

The Rapid DNA Act of 2017 calls for DNA testing of arrestees in police booking stations, with the goal of identifying arrestees wanted in connection with rapes, murders, and other crimes while they are still in police custody (insteed of being released within hours, without performing DNA identification, as is currently the case). By identifying suspects quickly, Rapid DNA testing of arrestees has the potential to identify repeat criminals, drematically reducing the rate of violent crimes. The Rapid DNA Act of 2017 requires NDIS approval of Rapid DNA Systems to be used in police booking stations, and ANDE is the first and only system to receive this approval.

#### About the NDIS approval

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ANDE accelerates the DNA processing from taking months or even years to less than two hours. A comprehensive developmental validation study evaluated the ANDE Rapid DNA Identification System's overall process-from inserting cheek swabs to ANDE DNA ID generation; testing

#### The Rapid DNA Act of 2017

The bipartisan, bicameral Rapid DNA Act of 2017 was passed in the Senate and the House of Representatives on May 16, 2017.

The Repid DNA Act establishes a system for the integration of Rapid DNA instruments for use by law enforcement "to solve end prevent violent crimes and other crimes, to exonerate the innocem, to prevent DNA enelysis backlogs". Unlike traditional DNA enalysis, which can take weeks, Repid DNA enalysis processes DNA samples in less then two hours.

This technology has the potential to change the paradigm for law enforcement. It can be deployed in investigative operations and booking facilities. Rapid DNA provides law enforcement officials with a new system that meets FBI quality assurance standards to compare DNA samples collected at the time of an arrest to profiles in the Combined DNA (ndex System (CODIS).

Author of the bill, Senator Orrin Hatch said, 'This commonsense proposal will enable law enforcement to analyze DNA in record time, reducing backlogs in rape kits and keeping violent criminals off our streets. By facilitating the use of rapid DNA technology, this bill will also help to exonerate those wrongly accused of crime."

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#### **DNA IDs and Privacy:**

DNA IDs are not Genetic Profiles - the two tests look at different aspects of an individual, are performed for different purposes. A DNA ID simply identifies an individual, while a Genetic Profile is designed to assess the health of an individual, and contains essentially every piece of genetic information in the human genome. To put this in perspective, a DNA ID contains approximately one-millionth of the information in a Genetic Profile.

DNA IDs are the optimal identification tool for two major reasons:

- DNA IDs are far more accurate than any other biometric modality including conventional fingerprints, facial recognition, iris scans, and voice recognition.
- DNA IDs preserve privacy they contain absolutely no useful information about an individual other than identification. A DNA ID contains much less usable information than an individual's address, phone number, photograph, or browser search history.

The ability of DNA IDs to identify a person with exquisite accuracy is accompanied by an emphasis on privacy protection - the DNA ID generates absolutely no information concerning an individual's health or body composition or organic strengths or weaknesses.

Besides identifying an individual, DNA IDs can do two other things:

- DNA IDs can determine gender. This is accomplished by determining if an individual has
  just X chromosomes (female) or X and Y chromosomes (male). Gender is a politicallycharged topic in some circles today so to be clear, DNA IDs determine gender based
  solely on chromosomes.
- DNA IDs from two or more individuals can be compared to determine if the individuals are close biological relatives. DNA is passed from parent to child, and each child inherits half of his or her DNA from each parent. That means that by comparing DNA iDs, it is essentially always possible to determine if two people are parent, and child, often possible to determine if two people are likely to be siblings, and sometimes possible to determine if two people are likely to be grandparent-grandchild or aunt/uncles-niece/nephew. The use of DNA IDs in kinship analysis has been applied to Law Enforcement (familial searching), paternity testing, immigration, and disaster victim identification.

DNA IDs represent the most accurate and most private approach to human identification. The test provides Law Enforcement with a highly effective public safety tool while preserving the privacy of our citizens.

Auto Renew:

Pricing:

Section 210 - DNA Testing Upon Arrest - Collection, Analysis, Destruction, and Expungement of DNA Samples

#### This Statute Will Go Into Effect On: 11/01/2019

Cite as: 22 Q.S. § 210 (OSCN 2019)

A. Subject to the availability of funds, a person eighteen (18) years of age or older who is arrested for the commission of a felony under the laws of this state or any other jurisdiction shall, upon being booked into a jail or detention facility, submit to deoxyribonucleic acid (DNA) sample collection for testing for DNA-identification-matching purposes in accordance with Section 150.27a of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes and the rules promulgated by the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation (OSBI) for the OSBI Combined DNA Index System (CODIS) Database. DNA samples shall be collected by trained medical personnel, law enforcement, tribal police officers, or employees or medical contractors of those organizations as qualified pursuant to subsection B of this section.

B. Samples of blood or saliva for DNA testing or for DNA-identification-matching purposes required by subsection A of this section shall be taken by trained medical personnel, law enforcement, tribal police officers, or employees or medical contractors of those organizations. The individuals shall be properly trained to collect blood or saliva samples. Persons collecting blood or saliva for DNA testing or for DNA-identification-matching purposes pursuant to this section shall be immune from civil liabilities arising from this activity. All collectors of DNA samples shall ensure the collected samples are mailed or delivered to the OSBI within ten (10) days after the DNA sample is collected from the person using sample kits provided by the OSBI and procedures promulgated by the OSBI, or if the jail, detention facility, booking facility of a federally recognized American Indian tribe in Oklahoma or other designated facility is using Rapid DNA technology, the collector shall use the provided collection instruments. Once the DNA-identification-matching process has concluded and a sample has been mailed or delivered to the OSBI, the collector shall discard the Rapid DNA sample taken in the jail, detention facility, booking facility of a federally recognized American Indian tribe in Oklahoma or other designated facility.

If a jail, detention facility, booking facility of a federally recognized American Indian tribe in Oklahoma or other designated facility is using Rapid DNA technology to take the DNA sample for DNA identification purposes, said sample shall not be retained, tested or stored after completion of the Rapid DNA identification process. Any person charged with the custody and dissemination of DNA samples and profiles shall not divulge or disclose any such information except to federal, state, county or municipal law enforcement or criminal justice agencies, nor shall the person tamper with the samples and profiles taken. Any person violating the provisions of this section shall, upon conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment in the county jail for not more than one (1) year.

- C. A DNA sample shall not be analyzed and shall be destroyed unless one of the following conditions has been met:
- 1. The arrest was made upon a valid felony arrest or warrant;
- The person has appeared before a judge or magistrate judge who made a finding that there was probable cause for the arrest;
- 3. The person posted bond or was released prior to appearing before a judge or magistrate judge and then failed to appear for a scheduled hearing; or
- The DNA sample was provided as a condition of a plea agreement.
- D. All DNA samples, records and identifiable information generated pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be automatically expunged from the OSBI Combined DNA Index System (CODIS) Database under the following circumstances:

- 1. The felony offense for which the person was arrested does not result in charges either by information or indictment and the statute of limitations has expired;
- 2. The state voluntarily dismissed the felony charge filed against the person; or
- 3. The court dismissed the felony charge filed against the person.

The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation shall promulgate rules establishing procedures relating to the automatic expungement of DNA samples, records and identifiable information collected under the provisions of this section. Fees related to the expungement of DNA samples, records and identifiable information shall not be assessed for persons who qualify for an automatic expungement under the provisions of this subsection.

The 2017 US Census showed Tulsa County to have a population of Six Hundred Forty-six Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-six (646,266). While the bulk of the population resides within the City of Tulsa and Broken Arrow (404,170 and 107,403 respectively) One Hundred Thirty Four Thousand Six Hundred Ninety-three (134,693) residents of the county live outside the jurisdiction of the Tulsa Police Department and the Broken Arrow Police Department. Another Twenty Thousand Nine Hundred Twenty-eight reside within the jurisdiction of the City of Sapulpa. The population of Sapulpa showed to be Twenty Thousand Nine Hundred Twenty-eight (20,928). The Tulsa Police Department, Broken Arrow Police Department and Sapulpa Police Department have the tools (Cellbrite) and trained investigators to conduct forensic examinations of cell phones. One Hundred Thirteen Thousand Seven Hundred Sixty-five (113,735) Tulsa County residents live outside the jurisdictions of the municipal police departments mentioned above.

According to the United States Supreme Court as written in the Riley v California decision;

The current top-selling smart phone has a standard capacity of 16 gigabytes (and is available with up to 64 gigabytes). Sixteen gigabytes translates to millions of pages of text, thousands of pictures, or hundreds of videos. See Kerr, supra, at 404; Brief for Center for Democracy & Technology et al. as Amici Curiae 7–8. Cell phones couple that capacity with the ability to store many different types of information: Even the most basic phones that sell for less than \$20 might hold photographs, picture messages, text messages, Internet browsing history, a calendar, a thousand entry phone book, and so on. See id., at 30; United States v. Flores-Lopez, 670 F. 3d 803, 806 (CA7 2012). We expect that the gulf between physical practicability and digital capacity will only continue to widen in the future.

#### The same decision goes on to say;

In the cell phone context, however, it is reasonable to expect that incriminating information will be found on a phone regardless of when the crime occurred....It would be a particularly inexperienced or unimaginative law enforcement officer who could not come up with several reasons to suppose evidence of just about any crime could be found on a cell phone. Even an individual pulled over for something as basic as speeding might well have locational data dispositive of guilt on his phone. An individual pulled over for reckless driving might have evidence on the phone that shows

whether he was texting while driving. The sources of potential pertinent information are virtually unlimited,

#### (Bold added for emphasis)

One Hundred Thirteen Thousand Seven Hundred Sixty-five (113,735) Tulsa County residents live outside the jurisdiction of municipal agencies with the capability to conduct forensic cell phone examinations. The probability of a significant number of these citizens to become the victim of a violent crime and not have a law enforcement agency capable of conducting forensic cell phone examinations of the suspects' phones, while difficult to quantify precisely, is obvious.

The Tulsa County District Attorney's Office takes the position every resident who is the victim of violent crime within Tulsa County, regardless of whether they live in a municipality with resources to conduct forensic cell phone examinations, deserve the opportunity of justice and to live in safe communities. The successful prosecution and incarceration of violent offenders reduces the likelihood of the offender committing further acts of violence against the populace.

The ability of the Tulsa County District Attorney's Office to have Cellbrite, which is acknowledged as one of, if not the, best forensic cell phone examination tool, and trained investigators to operate the system will allow the office to serve the segment of the population which is currently underserved. The District Attorney's Office is also in the position to assist the agencies which do have the capability when those agencies have an over-load of cases and a hacklog of examinations.

It is time for Tulsa County to initiate the process to seek re-qualification with the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to receive Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds as an Urban County for the period of FY2020-2022. Tulsa County first attained urban county status for the qualification period FY2008-2010, so we are in our fifth requalification period. The CDBG Program provides federal funds to eligible units of local governments to address community development needs. CDBG regulations permit counties who meet the threshold of a total combined population of 200,000 or more (excluding metropolitan cities) to qualify as an urban county to receive a direct federal allocation of CDBG funds. The qualification period is for a renewable three-year period. The City of Broken Arrow and nine other Tulsa County jurisdictions participate as members of the Tulsa County Urban County. The City of Tulsa is not a member.

The requirements, procedures and deadlines to be followed in the urban county requalification process are set out in HUD Notice CPD-19-04. A packet is sent to the HUD Field Office which includes documentation of required notifications to members of the Urban County. One of the documents required is an opinion of County legal counsel that the terms and provisions of the Cooperation Agreements continue to be fully authorized under State and local law (under the Oklahoma Interlocal Cooperation Act); (CPD Notice 19-04 IV.E paragraph 2, Page 11). I have attached HUD Notice CPD-19-04 for your reference. I have also attached the Cooperation Agreement executed by the City of Broken Arrow in 2007; the Cooperation Agreement contains an automatic renewal provision, so we do not need to seek a new agreement each requalification period.

I am seeking your signature on the attached form Statement of the District Attorney, certifying that the terms and provisions of the Urban County Cooperation Agreement continue to be fully authorized under State law. The Assistant District Attorneys formerly in your position executed the Statement for the previous four requalification periods.

For this Qualification period, the HUD Notice CPD-19-04 contains a new requirement that existing Cooperation Agreements with automatic renewal provisions also contain a provision that units of general local government located within an urban county are prohibited from the sale, trade or otherwise transfer CDBG funds for unrestricted local funds. This is not practice that the Tulsa County Urban County engaged in (not even sure what it means), but the Cooperation Agreement must be amended to contain this provision. I have drafted the provision for your review and approval, and it is attached. All eleven members must sign the amendment, so we will produce individualized amendments.

This Amendment may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.

# **COOPERATION AGREEMENT**

A COOPERATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF BROKEN ARROW, OKLAHOMA AND THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF TULSA COUNTY, OKLAHOMA, FOR THE PURPOSE OF PARTICIPATION IN THE TULSA COUNTY URBAN COUNTY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM FOR FEDERAL FISCAL YEARS 2008-2010

This Cooperation Agreement ("Agreement") for Community Development Block Grant ("CDBG") funds is made and entered into this day day, 2007, by and between Tulsa County ("COUNTY"), and the City of Broken Arrow ("CITY").

WHEREAS, the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended (24 U.S.C. 93-383 et seq.), (the "Act"), provides that Community Development Block Grant, ("CDBG"), funds may be used for the support of activities that provide decent housing and suitable living environments and expanded economic opportunities principally for persons of low- and moderate-income; and,

WHEREAS, CDBG Regulations 24 CFR 570.307(a) allow counties having a total combined population of 200,000 or more from the unincorporated areas and participating incorporated areas to qualify as an urban county; and,

WHEREAS, the COUNTY meets this threshold and has requested of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, ("HUD"), that the COUNTY be designated as an "urban county" as set forth in the Act; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY has complied with all requirements for Counties seeking urban county entitlement status under the CDBG program; and

WHEREAS, Section 1008 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Interlocal Cooperation Act permits local units of government to contract with other localities to perform any service or activity for which they are authorized to perform by law and to cooperate with other localities on a basis of mutual advantage; and

WHEREAS, the CITY is eligible for a CDBG formula allocation as a Metropolitan City but desires to relinquish its entitlement status for three years to participate with the COUNTY in the urban county CDBG program; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY shall act in a representative capacity for all participating units of general local government and shall assume overall responsibility for ensuring that the urban county CDBG Program is carried out in compliance with federal rules, regulations and requirements of the CDBG Program, including requirements for a Consolidated Plan; and

WHEREAS, the governing bodies of each of the parties hereto have determined to enter into this Agreement for the aforesaid public purpose and undertaking.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties identified below mutually agree as follows:

# I. PURPOSE

The COUNTY and CITY agree that the purpose of this Agreement is to cooperate to undertake, or assist in undertaking, community renewal and lower income housing assistance activities, funded from annual CDBG Program appropriations for the federal fiscal years for which the COUNTY qualifies for entitlement as an urban county and from any program income generated from the expenditure of such funds.

# II. TERM OF AGREEMENT

The term of this Agreement shall be the COUNTY CDBG Urban County qualification period of the federal fiscal years 2008-2010, commencing on August 1, 2008, and ending on July 31, 2011, unless an earlier date of termination is fixed by HUD, pursuant to the Act. Notwithstanding the above, if there are activities undertaken pursuant to this Agreement that are not yet completed or funded, then for the purpose of those activities only, this AGREEMENT shall remain in effect until all CDBG funds received pursuant to this AGREEMENT, and any program income received with respect to activities carried out pursuant to this AGREEMENT are

expended, and the funded activities are completed.

# III. NOTIFICATION OF ELIGIBILITY

The CITY represents that the COUNTY has notified the CITY, in writing, of its intention to seek qualification for CDBG Program funding as an urban county; and that such notification advised the City:

- A. That the CITY was eligible to elect to have its population excluded from that of the urban county for the purposes of the CDBG Program; and
- **B.** That the CITY's election or failure to make an election shall be effective for the full three year period for which the COUNTY qualifies to receive a CDBG Program entitlement as an urban county, and
- C. That the CITY, in becoming part of the urban county, would relinquish its status as a CDBG direct entitlement recipient, and
- D. That the CITY, in becoming part of the urban county, would not be eligible to apply for grants under the HUD-Administered Small Cities or State CDBG programs while the CITY is a part of the urban county; and
- E. That the CITY, through separate agreement, participates in the HOME Program through the Tulsa County HOME Consortium, although this does not preclude the urban county or a unit of local government within the urban county from applying for State HOME funds to the extent allowable by the State

# IV. PERIOD OF QUALIFICATION

- A. The COUNTY and CITY acknowledge that the COUNTY's qualification by HUD as an urban county shall remain effective for three (3) consecutive Federal Fiscal years 2008-2010, regardless of changes in its population or boundary or population changes in any communities contained within the urban county during that period, except as otherwise provided by 24 C.F.R. Part 570.307(f).
- B. The COUNTY and CITY acknowledge that, for grant calculation purposes, during the period of urban county qualification, the CITY, as an included unit of general local government, may not withdraw from the urban county unless the COUNTY does not receive a grant for any year during such period of qualification.

# V. AUTOMATIC RENEWAL PROVISION

- A. The COUNTY and CITY agree that this agreement will renew automatically at the end of each three-year qualification period, unless the COUNTY or the participating unit of general local government provides written notice it elects not to participate in a new qualification period.
- B. By the date specified in HUD's Urban County Qualification Notice for the next qualification period, the urban county will notify the participating unit of general local government in writing of its right not to participate.
- **C.** The COUNTY and CITY agree:
- 1. To adopt any amendment(s) to this Agreement incorporating changes that are necessary to meet HUD requirements for cooperation agreements set forth in any future Urban County Qualification Notice(s) that apply to a subsequent three-year urban county qualification period; and
- 2. To submit such amendment(s) to HUD as provided in the applicable Urban County Qualification Notice; and
- 3. That failure to comply with these requirements shall void the automatic renewal for such qualification period.

# VI, DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS

- A. The COUNTY and CITY agree, for each fiscal year covered by this AGREEMENT, CDBG funds will be allocated by the COUNTY to CITY in an amount greater than the amount that CITY would have received if it had retained its status as a Metropolitan City as identified by HUD.
- B. Notwithstanding the above, in no event shall the COUNTY be obligated to distribute more funds to CITY under this AGREEMENT than the COUNTY receives during the three-year agreement period.
- C. CITY retains sole authority over the award and implementation of all CDBG funds allocated to CITY under this AGREEMENT. CITY may contract with other entities to perform CDBG-eligible activities, confirmed with a written contract that contains provisions specified in the CDBG Regulations at 24 CFR 570.

# VII. REQUIRED ACTIONS

The COUNTY and CITY agree to take all required actions necessary to assure compliance with the COUNTY's urban county certification required by Section 104(b) of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, including Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, the Fair Housing Act, Section 109 of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, and all other applicable laws.

# VIII. FAIR HOUSING ACTIVITIES

- A. The COUNTY and CITY acknowledge and agree that the COUNTY and CITY are required to take steps to affirmatively further fair housing.
- B. The COUNTY and CITY acknowledge and agree that urban county CDBG Program funding shall not be permitted or made available for activities in or in support of the CITY if it is determined that the CITY does not affirmatively further fair housing within its own jurisdiction or impedes the COUNTY's actions to comply with its fair housing certification.

# IX. CIVIL RIGHTS POLICIES

The COUNTY and CITY acknowledge and represent to the other that they have adopted and are enforcing the following policies:

- A. A policy prohibiting the use of excessive force by law enforcement agencies within their respective jurisdictions against any individuals engaged in non-violent civil rights demonstrations; and
- **B.** A policy of enforcing applicable State and local laws against physically barring entrance to or exit from a facility or location which is the subject of such non-violent civil rights demonstrations within the jurisdiction.

# X. REQUIREMENTS APPLICABLE TO SUBRECIPIENTS

The COUNTY and CITY acknowledge and agree that, pursuant to 24 C.F.R. 570.501(b), the CITY shall be subject to the same requirements applicable to

subrecipients, including the requirement for a written agreement as set forth in 24 CFR 570.503.

# XI. CONSOLIDATED PLAN

- A. The COUNTY and CITY acknowledge and understand that a Consolidated Plan including a comprehensive affordable housing strategy is required of the COUNTY, as an urban county, and that the Consolidated Plan must be submitted to and approved by HUD.
- B. The COUNTY and CITY agree that neither party, during the period covered by this Agreement, shall obstruct the implementation of the Consolidated Plan as approved by HUD.

# XII DURATION OF AGREEMENT

- A. The COUNTY and CITY acknowledge that this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect for the period beginning with Federal Fiscal Year 2008 until CDBG Program and HOME Program funds and program income received with respect to activities carried out during the three-year qualification period, and any successive periods thereafter, are expended and the funded activities are completed.
- B. The COUNTY and CITY agree that for the duration of each urban county qualification period covered by this Agreement, neither party may terminate, cancel, withdraw from, or, in any way, impair this Agreement.

# XIII. LEGAL AUTHORITY

The COUNTY represents that counsel for the COUNTY has reviewed the terms and provisions of this Agreement, and amendments thereto, and that said counsel has determined that the terms and provisions of this Agreement are fully authorized under State law, as provided by O.S Title 74 Section 1008, as well as local law, and that the Agreement provides full legal authority for the COUNTY to undertake, or assist in undertaking, essential community development and housing assistance activities, consistent with the CDBG Program.

This office is helping the City of Springs with the sale of two lots owned by City, namely Lots 17 and 18, Block 2, Sunrise Addition to the City of Sand Springs.

These two lots were acquired by Tulsa County by a resale tax deed. The Tulsa County Commission then attempted to pass the lots to the City of Sand Springs by a Quit Claim Deed dated August 14, 2017. A copy of that deed is enclosed herewith.

As can be seen from the face of that deed, the legal description on the deed is incomplete in that it omitted the designation of "Block 2" from the legal description.

There was an attempt to correct this deed but all that was done was that a cover sheet with a full and correct legal description was added to the deed and the deed re-filed of record. A copy of said corrected deed is also enclosed.

However, because a change is the legal description is a "material alteration" of the original deed, such material alteration must be made by having a new deed re-executed, re-acknowledged, re-delivered, and re-recorded (See Title Standard 3.5).





# **Interagency Agreement**

The Tulsa Area Community Intervention Center, being operated by the Tulsa County Family Center for Juvenile Justice (Bureau), agrees to provide services to local municipalities regarding police officer contact with Tulsa County juvenile offenders. The City of Collinsville, being one of the municipalities served, agrees to access said services and to monetarily support the continued operation of the Tulsa Area Community Intervention Center, hereafter referred to as TACIC. The guidelines for the implementation of services are as follows:

## TACIC will:

- Assist law enforcement officers by providing a 24 hour, 7 days a week, short-term retaining facility for quick drop-off of arrested juveniles so officers can return to their duties in the community;
- Provide a safe and secure environment for juveniles who have been arrested for violation a municipal ordinance or state law;
- Help reduce recidivism of juvenile offenders by delivering intervention for delinquent behavior;
- Detect and address the underlying causes of delinquent or problem behaviors on the front end as a preventative measure;
- Intervene before problems escalate into chronic or more serious offenses;
- Create a more effective and efficient alliance between police, parents, juvenile justice and treatment providers;
- Provide intake assessments, which include:
  - > Verification of Detention eligibility
  - > Verification of TACIC admittance criteria. Once admitted, continued intake to include:
    - 1. Intake Screening OJA-5 Assessment Tool
    - 2. Enter/Update JOLTS
    - 3. Juvenile Justice Background Information
    - 4. Secure Signed Promise to Appear
    - 5. Voluntary Comprehensive Assessment
    - 6. Community Referrals/Follow Up
    - 7. Release to Parent, Guardian, or another Responsible Adult
    - 8. Transmit Information to Court Systems (Both Municipal and District)

# The City of Collinsville will utilize services as needed by:

- Transporting juvenile offenders to TACIC's secure facility located at 600 Civic Center Plaza, Suite 110, Tulsa, OK. 74103, phone number (918) 596-7580;
- Officers will cooperate with TACIC staff regarding intake procedures;
- Officers will transport juvenile offenders to Tulsa County Juvenile Detention Center located at 315 S. Gilcrease Museum Rd., Tulsa, OK. 74126, should detention stays be applicable; and,
- Officers will be responsive to call-back by TACIC staff should more information be needed, or additional charges apply (contraband, destruction of public property, staff assault).

Whereas, above mentioned services are available, The City of Collinsville agrees to provide a one-time payment of <u>two thousand four hundred dollars and no cents (\$2400.00)</u> to the Tulsa County Juvenile Bureau.

Whereas, the sum of two thousand four hundred dollars and no cents (\$2400.00) is submitted to the Tulsa County Juvenile Bureau, TACIC agrees to offer services during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020.

This agreement may be revised annually, providing both parties agree on revised content. This agreement is only active pending both parties' signatures and is not to be implied as a legal contract between acting parties.

# USER AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between Board of County Commissioners of the County of Tulsa on behalf of its Parks Department, hereinafter referred to as "PARKS" and **Metro Tulsa Baseball Association**, hereinafter referred to as "ORGANIZATION".

The term of this agreement shall be from the 1 day of July 2019 to Oct day of 30, 2019, 1pm-11pm.

ORGANIZATION shall have the right of use of the following facilities during the times and on the dates specified.

#### NEEDS TO PROVIDE DATES 45 DAY IN ADVANCE FOR USAGE OF SITES.

- ORGANIZATION may charge admissions for events and entry fees for classes and tournaments. All income derived from such admission fees and entry fees shall be utilized solely to defray ORGANIZATION'S expenses. ORGANIZATION shall render a written financial report to the Parks Division of Tulsa County at the end of the contract period, disclosing all income and disbursements related to ORGANIZATON'S use of COUNTY'S facilities.
- 2. It is understood the ORGANIZATION is using the above-described facilities solely for the purposes herein set forth. ORGANIZATION assumes absolute responsibility and sole liability for the acts and actions of ORGANIZATION'S program participants and spectators during the use of said facilities at the time scheduled.
- ORGANIZATION shall pay \$20.00 per game, (we will deduct the receipts for materials to repair the O'Brien baseball fields) for usage of the O'Brien East and West baseball fields.
- 4. ORGANIZATION shall maintain Commercial General Liability Insurance specifically related to the Organization's use and occupancy of the above described facilities issued by a company or companies authorized to do business in the State of Oklahoma, naming the County as an additional insured party, and providing coverage in amounts not less than the amounts required to insure against liability under the Oklahoma Governmental Tort Claims Act, including any amendments thereto subsequent to the date of this Agreement. Such agrees to give the COUNTY at least fifteen (15) days prior notice in the event of cancellation or material alteration of the provision of ORGANIZATION'S insurance coverage. Until such insurance policies or certificates thereof having been approved by PARKS, this agreement shall be without force or effect. In the event of cancellation or termination of any of the insurance policies or certificates herein required, this agreement shall immediately become null and void. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to limit or waive ORGANIZATION'S immunity from liability under the laws now in existence, or exiting in the future.

- 5. ORGANIZATION further agrees that each program participant of ORGANIZATION, along with each of such participants, parents or legal guardians, shall execute a release of liabitity, in form acceptable to PARKS, which shall exonerate Tulsa County and the Board of County Commissioners, their agents and employees of Tulsa County from any and all Bability as a result of injury to such participants associated with the use of County's facilities. This includes any participants joining the program of ORGANIZATION after the commencement of the program. This release shall be delivered to Tulsa County Parks no later than one week prior to beginning of trials, training, workouts, practices and/or events.
- 6. ORGANIZATION shall not sublet any Tulsa County Parks space, nor assign, hypothecate or mortgage this agreement or any of the right hereunder. Refer inquiries of usage to the Tulsa County Parks.
- 7. ORGANIZATION shall be responsible for all security at the premises during the events.
- 8. PARKS reserves the right to cancel, with or without cause, this Agreement upon 10 days written notice, to be effective upon mailing to ORGANIZATION at the address herein provided by ORGANIZATION. This right to cancel on behalf of Tulsa County Parks includes, but is not limited to, ORGANIZATION'S violation of any naise of conduct duty adopted for use of County facilities, which rules are attached hereto and made a part hereof, as terms and conditions of ORGANIZATION'S use pursuant to this Agreement.





- 1. Work to be performed on County right-of-way must be under the direction of the Tulsa county Engineer, who must be notified of the time when the work is to begin. Under no circumstances will any work be done on County right-of-way until approval of the Tulsa County Engineer has been obtained.
- 2. One copy of an approved permit must be kept at the work site for inspection by the Tulsa County Engineer or his representative. Applicant will be required to have an inspector or engineer present at all time during construction to insure that installation is made in accordance with plans.
- 3. The applicant must agree to hold the COUNTY harmless for any damage (s) or injury (ies) to any person(s) or property (ies) caused by or resulting directly or indirectly from the construction, maintenance, operation or repair of the facilities on, under, or over the County right-of-way and must further agree to reimburse the COUNTY for any repair of any damage to COUNTY facilities caused by the construction and/or operation of the applicant's facility.
- 4. All work on the County right-of-way is to be done in accordance with the current Standard Specifications for Highway Construction, Oklahoma State Highway Commission, and at the conclusion of such work the right-of-way must be cleaned up and left in a presentable condition. The measurement to determine the amount of deposit shall be measured along centerline of trench for paralleling roadway, and for boring or trenching the measured centerline of trench from right-of-way line to right-of-way line. After final inspection by the County Engineer's Office, and an additional period of ninety days, the deposit less any amount not used to restore the area shall be returned to the depositor.
- 5. The applicant must furnish all flagmen, lights, barricades, and warning signs deemed necessary by the COUNTY, during the construction maintenance, or repair of its facilities on the County right-of-way.
- 6. When notified to do so by the COUNTY, the applicant agrees to make all changes in the facilities on a County right-of-way at the applicant's own expense, unless otherwise provided by law or order of the COUNTY.
- 7. Encasement for underground telephone and power lines, or similar facilities, should comply with the above except for the installation of vents, end seals, and the ability to contain and divert.

Steel pipelines crossing the right-of-way may be installed without encasement if the installation is in accordance with "Special Provisions for the Installation of Underground Pipelines...". This Special Provision stipulates in part that carrier pipe material within the right-of-way must be superior to the carrier pipe material outside the right-of-way by being of steel at least one grade better, or a minimum of one wall width thicker and the same alloy. Pipe must be 48 inches below the flow line of drainage ditches and all other highway drainage facilities, and must be properly protected from corrosion.


Nonpressurized facilities, such as sanitary sewer lines, crossing the highway right-of-way may be approved without the use of encasement, if cast iron or material of equal or better quality is used, with the understanding that maintenance will be performed by a method that will not disturb the through lanes or interfere with traffic.

All underground crossings must be installed by boring or pushing or other approved methods. The method and equipment for the installation must be approved by the COUNTY. Wet boring or jetting will not be permitted unless special approval is obtained from the COUNTY. If considered necessary, pressure grouting of the voids will be required. - 9. The applicant must agree to refrain from disturbing trees, shrubbery or any part of the landscape without approval of the COUNTY. If it becomes necessary to disturb trees or shrubbery, applicant intentions must be plainly stated in the application, which will include size and kind of trees and shrubs, and disposition during installation.
- 10. Blasting will not be permitted within the highway right-of-way except in unusual cases and only with special approval from the County Engineer.
- 11. The applicant must agree to hold the COUNTY harmless for any and all damage that the utility facilities might sustain while occupying County right-of-way.
