Voter Registration Deadline is January 18

Friday, January 18, is the last day to apply for voter registration in order to be eligible to vote in the February 12 Board of Education Primary Election for Tulsa Public Schools Office 1, Board of Education General Election for Tulsa Public Schools Office 2 Unexpired Term, City of Owasso Ward 5 Municipal Primary Election, City of Sand Springs Ward 2 Municipal Primary Election, City of Bixby Special Utility Franchise Election and ISD 5 Jenks Public Schools Special Propositions Election, Tulsa County Election Board Secretary Gwen Freeman said today.

Freeman said that persons who are United States citizens, residents of Oklahoma, and at least 18 years old may apply to become registered voters.

Those who aren't registered or need to change their registration may apply by filling out and mailing an Oklahoma Voter Registration Application form in time for it to be postmarked no later than midnight Friday, January 18.

Freeman said applications postmarked after that time will be accepted and processed, but not until after February 12.

The County Election Board responds in writing to every person who submits an application for voter registration. The response is either a voter identification card listing the new voter's precinct number and polling place location or a letter that explains the reason or reasons the application for voter registration was not approved. Freeman said any person who has submitted a voter registration application and who has not received a response within 30 days should contact the County Election Board office.

Oklahoma Voter Registration Application forms are available at the County Election Board office located at 555 North Denver Avenue, Tulsa, and at most post offices, tag agencies and public libraries in the county. Applications also are available at www.elections.ok.gov.
