Voter Registration Deadline is MARCH 12

Friday, March 12, is the last day to apply for voter registration in order to be eligible to vote in the April 6, Board of Education General Elections for ISD-1 Tulsa Public Schools District 3, ISD-10 Berryhill Public Schools Office No.I, ISD-9 Union Public Schools Office No.I, ISD-2 Sand Springs Public Schools Office No.1, ISD-8 Sperry Public Schools Office No.I, ISD-11 Owasso Public Schools Office No.1 and Tulsa Technology Center District 6, as well as the Municipal General Elections for the City of Broken Arrow Council Member Wards 1 and 2, City of Glenpool Councilor Ward 2, City of Jenks Councilmember Wards 4 and At Large and a Special Municipal General Election for the City of Skiatook Councilmember Wards 2 and 5; as well as ISD-14 Liberty Public Schools Special Propositions Election and City of Bixby Special Propositions Election Tulsa County Election Board Secretary Gwen Freeman said today.

Freeman said that persons who are United States citizens, residents of Oklahoma, and at least 18 years old may apply to become registered voters.

Those who are not registered or need to change their registration may apply by filling out and mailing an Oklahoma Voter Registration Application form in time for it to be postmarked no later than midnight Friday, March 12.

Freeman said applications postmarked after that time will be accepted and processed, but not until after April 6.

The County Election Board responds in writing to every person who submits an application for voter registration. The response is either a voter identification card listing the new voter's precinct number and polling place location or a letter that explains the reason or reasons the application for voter registration was not approved. Freeman said any person who has submitted a voter registration application and who has not received a response within 30 days should contact the County Election Board office.

Oklahoma Voter Registration Application forms are available at the County Election Board office located at 555 N. Denver Avenue and at most post offices, tag agencies and public libraries in the county. Applications also are available at www.elections.ok.gov.
