LAST WEEK TO REQUEST ABSENTEE BALLOTS FOR SEPTEMBER 14 ELECTION

The deadline to request absentee ballots by mail for the September 14 ISD-6 Collinsville Public Schools Special Bond Election is approaching. Applications must be received by the County Election Board no later than 5 p.m. Tuesday, September 7.

Tulsa County Election Board Secretary, Gwen Freeman, says absentee voting is available to all voters and can be submitted several ways.

"In Oklahoma, no excuse is needed to vote by absentee ballot, and it's easy to apply! Voters can submit their application online, in-person, by fax, mail, or even email."

Voters can apply on line using the OK Voter Portal at oklahoma.gov/elections/ovp. Applications are also available at the County Election Board or can be downloaded at oklahoma.gov/elections.

Freeman reminds voters that only the applicant can submit his or her own absentee ballot application. It is against the law to submit an absentee ballot application for another person. Voters who submit their application in-person at the County Election Board will be asked to provide proof of identity.
